

Year 3 Newsletter Autumn 1

We are delighted to welcome you all to Year Three. We have been so impressed with how well the children have settled into school into Year 3 and it has been wonderful to see how enthusiastic they have been about their learning. Our learning challenge for this half term is 'How are volcanoes, Earthquakes and mountains formed?' This challenge focuses on the geography of how our Earth, looking closely at the layers of the Earth and Plate tectonics etc.



This term the children will be recapping and learning skills such as:

- Capital letters
- Full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Conjunctions when, although, if, that because
- Choosing technical vocabulary carefully.

This half term the children will be learning to write an explanation text on volcanoes, earthquakes and mountains...

Maths

This half term we will be focusing on:

Place Value

- Recapping 10s and 1s, and introducing 100s.
- Read and write 3 digit numbers in words and numbers.
- Partition 3 digit numbers and use this to help you add and subtract.
- 1 more, 1 less, 10 more, 10 less 100 more and 100 less using 3 digit numbers.
- Order and group 3 digit numbers based on their values.

Reading at Home

Please encourage your child to read as often as possible at home. Please ensure to post a comment, on Seesaw, once per week to let your child's class teacher know how they are progressing with their reading at home. This can be a sentence or two to say how fluently they have read and to identify words they found tricky. Remember your child can change their books every day in class. Your child will bring home one colour banded book which can be read independently and one reading for pleasure book which they may need support reading.

Reading Record

Please help your child to read daily at home. It is important to share with your child's class teacher how they are progressing with their reading at home. Please post a comment, on Seesaw, once per week. This can be a short sentence or two to say how fluently they have read and what vocabulary they found tricky to read or new words the have encountered.

E.g.

John read fluently today. Tricky words - electricity, enough

Times Tables Practise

It is really important that your child practises their times tables at home to support their math learning at school. In Year 2 the children learnt the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. In Year 3 we learn the 4, 8 and 3 times tables. We highly recommend using www.timestables.co.uk to help support your child to learn their times tables facts and develop fluency in their recall. You can also use Times Tables Rockstars.

Spelling Shed

Your child will be set spellings to practise each week at home. The games on Spelling Shed are a fun and exciting way to engage your child in practising their spelling at home.
