Reading at Home



Reading at home is an essential part of a child's daily routine and we are encouraging children to read at home for at least 15 minutes a day in Years 1-6 and at least 10 minutes in Early Years. Children in Year 1-6 will continue to use **Seesaw** to post pictures of the reading books they are taking home. Parents and Carers can support their child's reading routines by listening to them read out loud on a daily basis. We would

like children to record voice notes and comment on their reading posts regularly. Seesaw comments posted can be about your child's enjoyment of the book or new vocabulary explored.

This year, we are also introducing **Book Talk** sessions every **Monday** in all year groups. These sessions will involve children discussing the book they are currently reading with their peers in class. In order to facilitate these sessions, please ensure that your child brings their reading books into school every Monday.

In EYFS, children will record their reading using reading diaries; more information regarding this will follow in a reading letter from Miss Silva.

We would like your continued support by encouraging children to regularly bring their books into school, changing them when finished and commenting on Seesaw to record their reading. Please note, there will be a cost of £5 for lost reading books so we would like your support in ensuring books are returned when borrowed from school.
