Start and finish times

Start of the day



We open our doors at 8:50am at the start of each day. Parents and Carers, you are welcome to accompany your child into class on their first day, their second day...and maybe their third if you think it is necessary. From next week (beginning 25th), all of our new starters will have been enrolled so children will be welcomed independently of parents. This does not mean that you are locked out! There will be


many occasions throughout the Reception year when we will extend a warm invitation for you to join us.

End of day

RNH and RS leave at 3:10pm RO, RB and RSH leave at 3:20pm

End-of-day times are staggered due to the huge number of children we need to release safely. We navigate this routine by insisting that our class children remain in a line as we dismiss, one by one. Please resist the urge to beckon to your child and invite them to exit if we have not yet seen / acknowledged you. We need to make certain of each child's safe dismissal. Thank you for your patience.

<u>Lunch and ordering in advance</u> <u>on School Grid</u>



All Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children have the universal offer of a free lunch.

To order your child's lunch you must have completed / returned the School Grid form in your starter pack. We have spare sheets if necessary.

Each week, please make your menu choices at home so you can help your child choose a varied diet. The catering team can ensure It helps our catering team greatly if menu choices can be made in advance. Thank you for your assistance with this.

PE



PE sessions take place each Monday with Mr Knowles and Mr Josh. It is easier for your child's kit to remain in school, in their locker and we will return this to you, periodically at the end of each half term.

Global Goals Week



As a response to the 'half-time conversation' through Global Goals week, we will be introducing the children to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals and thinking hard about how we can make a difference. Reception (along with all of school) will be putting forward class pledges related to one goal or a family of goals. Reading Books



You will have received a new reading diary, letter and set of three books. The letter details everything about our reading programme for this half term including our when we change books. A copy was also emailed, just recently.

Welcome to Reading in Reception. Reading, of course, is a multi-faceted skill - from the mechanics of phonemes and graphemes to meaning and motivation. In the early years at Beaver Road, we use a belanced approach to the teaching of reading. We follow the Essential Letters and Sounds phonics programme which is designed to build children's decoding capacity, i.e. sounding out words into component parts and blending into full words. Alongside the mechanics of decoding, other word-reading strategies are used: visual cluses, pictures, sight-reading (words that cannot be broken into phonic building blocks), and working out a word from the context of others. Comprehension, interpretation, imagining and inferering are skills that run in tandem to the word-reading elements. In this way, children can be discerning and enjoy a holistic reading experience.

Home Reading In the first half term, we will share three home reading books per week. Books will be changed each Friddy and an entry will be made in your reading diary. Books must be brought to school in a Beaver









We have more to share with you about reading in Reception and we will talk to you about all the detail during our Curriculum Zoom Session on 27th September.

Names on clothing



Please can you ensure that all items of uniform, outdoor clothing, shoes, water bottles and lunch bags are clearly marked with your child's name. It is impossible to reacquaint children with cardigans / jumpers if they are unnamed. Thank you for help with this!

Paint / overalls



It has come to our attention that the 'washable paint' we use might not be everything it says on the tin! As a precaution and to avoid permanent staining on clothing, we will ensure full length shirts are in use as well as restocking our paint with a different brand as and when it needs replenishing.
