We are almost at the end of our first half term together in Reception! The last few weeks have certainly flown by and it feels like our collective small feet haven't touched the ground. As you know, we try to capture some of Reception life via our Tapestry learning journal. A steady stream of home observations, published by families, are being shared each week. We love receiving home broadcasts and will always type a return message! We are now well underway with our Essential Letters and Sounds phonics programme. Thank you for your commitment to the reading schedule and recording your thoughts and observations of your child's home reading experience. We have now added a useful 'crib sheet' guide to our agreed script (how to write the letters of the alphabet) to your reading diaries, for reference.

<u>Black History Month</u>



As part of our Black History Month exploration, the children have been reading Floella Benjamin's book, 'Coming to England'. Floella's story has provoked and inspired a wider conversation around themes such as discrimination, belonging and courage. We've held these discussions in an age-appropriate way and used the language of Rights to help frame our thinking especially through the lens of Article 2 - non discrimination. This, in turn has led to wider conversations around difference and calling out stereotypes.

We are taking inspiration from Floella's story to create our own Reception installation of artwork and photography to be shared as part of the whole-school BHM exhibition.

For part of the display, we are in need of some suitcases, preferably of a vintage style. If you have one and can donate, we would really appreciate it. Thank you.

<u>9am - locking of the school gate</u>



Just recently, you may have heard a more insistant ring of the bell at drop-off. To safeguard all of our children, the gate must be locked at 9am which in turn means that late arrivals (even by a minute or two!) will need to enter via the school office. There cannot be any compromise on safety and we hope you understand and support our 'strictness' with this.
