<u>Week 4</u> Words ending with the /f/, /l/, /s/z/ or /k/ sound in English almost always have double consonant.	puff bell grass fizz clock
<u>Week 5</u> The /k/ sound is spelt as k rather than as c before e, i and y. The /nk/ sound found at the end of words usually comes after a vowel.	bank pink think kit sketch
<u>Week 6</u> Words ending '-tch'. The /ch/ sound is usually spelt as 'tch' when it comes after a single vowel letter.	catch kitchen match witch watch
<u>Week 7</u> Some words end with an /e/ sound spelled 'y'.	very happy funny party family
