

World Book Day – Thursday 2nd March

We are delighted to celebrate World Book Day this **Thursday 2nd March 2023**. However, as Year 4 will be swimming on this day, children in **Year 4 will have an alternate date** for World Book Day on **Friday 3rd March 2023**.

This year's World Book Day theme will be **Bravery.** Every year on World Book Day, we are blown away by the enthusiasm of our school community. Children are invited to highlight the theme in any creative way they feel, whether it is through a costume or by personalising their uniform. We know that this year families may find themselves in a difficult financial situation so we do not want our celebrations to be an additional cost. We would like to stress that dressing up is optional as we will be celebrating in lots of ways in school. Alternatively, children may wish to draw a picture at home to represent **Bravery** and bring it into school with them.

In order to mark this special occasion, we will be holding events such as Book Fairs, Drop Everything and Read (D.E.A.R), the Portico Book Review competition in Key Stage 2 on World Book Day and a production at the Junior School on 1st March 2023.


Scholastic Book Fair at Junior School: 27th March 2023 – 31st March 2023
