Home Learning



At the start of every half term, a new **home learning grid** along with the **spelling sheet** for the half term ahead will be uploaded to **Seesaw**. The home learning grid will support the different areas of the curriculum being taught at school. There are many optional activities to choose from. However, there will be a 'non-negotiable' box which your child is expected to complete weekly. These are: **upload reading to Seesaw, spellings (tested every Friday) and either a Manga High or spag.com activity** (please see the learning grid for more information). Class teachers will be monitoring home learning to check that it is being completed weekly.








Reading

Your child should be reading their colour banded book daily at home for 10-15 minutes. In line with our home learning expectations, your child needs to upload a post to Seesaw each week with a picture of the book or a note with the title/author and pages read. This will help us track and monitor reading in school. Remember your child can change their books every day in class. Your child will bring home one colour banded book which can be read independently and one reading for pleasure book which they may need support reading. Reading books need to be brought into school daily, so we can listen to your child read.



Important Information



PE days in Year 6 will be every **Monday** and **Thursday**. On Monday, our PE lessons will be either dance or gymnastics. On Thursday, the children will have outdoor games. Our PE kit is a black t-shirt and black shorts/leggings. In the colder/wetter months, your child will need jogging bottoms and a waterproof jacket for outdoor games.
