
Year 1 Newsletter





English

This term, the children will be reading 'Naughty Bus' they will also be learning

- Sentence writing
- Beginning to punctuate sentences
- Choosing adjectives carefully
- Creating their own innovated stories.

Maths





- Represent and use number bonds and subtraction facts within 10.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

Reading at Home

To help support your child, we ask parents and carers to read with their child daily at home! Frequent reading will enable your child to practise their phonics, their reading fluency, comprehension skills and recognising the key words for Year 1. A copy of these is available on the Year 1 class page under resources to support learning at home.

Please try to post a comment on Seesaw once per week, to let your child's class teacher know how they are progressing with their reading at home. The children are being taught to independently record their books on Seesaw. Your child will bring home one colour banded book, 1 phonics decodable book and one reading for pleasure book which is meant to be read together.

Children can change their books on any day when they have finished reading them. However, in order to support and monitor children's reading we ask that reading books are sent in every **Friday**. On Friday we will also be carrying out a book talk session so it is essential that all children have their book in to discuss.
