Start and Finish Times

We open our doors at 8:50am at the start of

each day. Moving forward, as all children are now enrolled, children will be welcomed independently of parents. This does not mean that you are locked out! There will be many occasions throughout the Nursery

year when we will extend a warm invitation for you to join us.

End of day

Door opens at 3.10pm

Can we respectfully ask families to stand back from the door at this time, this makes it easier for us to see and safely get the children to their adult. Children must only leave when called by a member of staff. We need to make certain of each child's safe dismissal. Thank you for your patience.

<u>Lunch and ordering in advance on</u> School Grid



To order your child's lunch you must have completed / returned the

School Grid form in your starter pack.
We have spare sheets if necessary.
Each week, please make your menu choices at home so you can help your child choose a varied diet. It helps our catering team greatly if menu choices can be made in advance.
Thank you for your assistance with this. It also assists children's learning and experience if the time organising lunches is minimal.

Names on belongings



Please can you ensure that all items of uniform, outdoor clothing, shoes, water bottles and lunch

bags are clearly marked with your

child's name. It is impossible to reacquaint children with cardigans / jumpers if they are unnamed. Thank you for help with this!

£5 fund

Each term, we invite families to make a voluntary contribution of £5 to fund additional projects and curriculum enhancements. No need to access ParentPay for this - we are happy to accept cash donations on the door. We intend to inform you of what your money has been used for in our newsletters.

We hope you have been able to download the Tapestry app. This will allow you to view your child's online learning journey through photos, videos, commentary and notes. We use Tapestry to capture your child's learning and tag the particular areas that are linked. You can view, like and respond to all our posts and you can

also upload your own observations.

It is really special and significant to the children when we share photos of their experiences outside of school in class.
