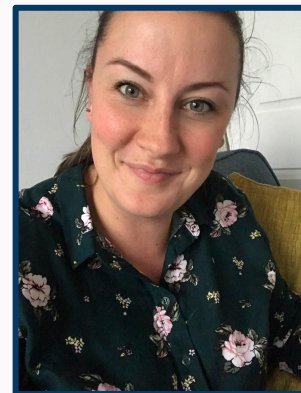

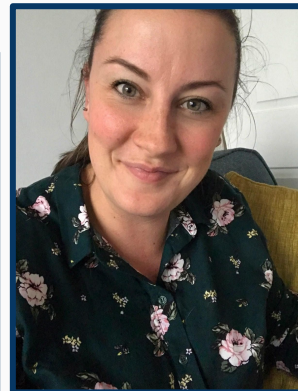

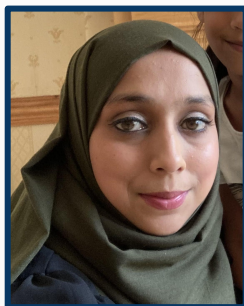

Meet The Team...

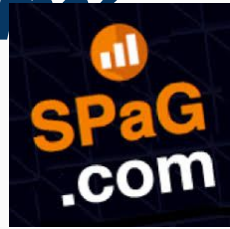

How can you support your child at home?



Each half term, a new home learning grid will be uploaded to Seesaw along with weekly spellings. Activities will be set each week on Spag.com and Mangahigh. Home learning activities are due on Friday and are monitored by class teachers. The activities set support learning happening in the classroom. Every Friday, there will be a spelling test in class. It is also important that your child reads at home and uploads this to Seesaw. This can be a photo of their book with page numbers read, or just a simple note.





What does a typical day look like in Year 6?

Our mornings start with a 'Morning Challenge' linked to our learning. For example: arithmetic, handwriting, spelling, grammar, reading etc. Teachers also use this time to give specific feedback to children about their work. It is important that your child arrives on time at 8:30.

School Uniform

- No jewellery (apart from small studs, which must be covered for PE)
- Plain black PE kits

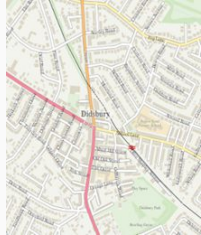
