# Our first half term in Reception...

"What makes me happy and healthy?" has been our focus for this half term. We have explored our emotions and become familiar with the systems that we have in school to help us with our emotions. We read Rainbow Fish and explored friendships. We have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know our new classes and their families.



We have begun teaching phonics and have already started to learn many of our new sounds. Please look out for a phonics at home sheet that your child will bring home with their books every Friday. Thank you for your positive engagement with this already, Please do not feel that you have to return these to us, we've enjoyed the updates on Tapestry and they are intended to be a little helpful tool for you to support your child with at home.

### Maths

In maths, we have been subitising and using our 'fast eyes to subitise.' Subitising is the skill of being able to see how many there are in a set without having to count. Your children have been practising subitising up to 3 objects. We have explored counting and have been supporting our maths teddy Marty Maths to learn how to count. We have agreed strategies for counting such as touching one object at a time and putting objects in a line. We have also looked at grouping objects and agreed reasoning on how and why objects may be grouped.





## This half term in Reception...



This half term, our learning challenge will be 'Where in the world do animals live?' Our focus texts will be 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear,' 'The Moose Belongs to Me,' 'Anansi the Spider' and 'Stick Man.' We will explore the natural habitats of a wide range of animals and make links to our prior learning about what makes us happy and healthy and consider what animals need to be happy and healthy. We will also be preparing for our spectacular Christmas performances and will send our information about your child's part and any lines that they may need to learn early into

the next half term.





As part of our learning about Black History Month, we are focusing on Floella Benjamin and her story 'Coming to England.' We have used this as a discussion point to find out more about our own backgrounds. We have really appreciated the Tapestry posts that we have received so far, please keep on uploading them as we intend to create a year group display with these.

We hope to see you at the Back History Month exhibition.
