Human Library Project

Would you like to be involved in our Human Library Project?

We are taking inspiration from the Danish concept by using the library analogy of lending people (conversations) rather than books, with a view to engaging in dialogue about expertise, cultures, and experiences. We want to use these conversations to promote empathy and broaden perspectives. It might be that you have a particular story to tell! Our vision is that volunteers can apply to become part of the Human Library and then create a 'human blurb' that will be added to a published collection for classes to browse / choose. A time and date would then be organised for classes to 'read' their human through a Q&A session, either virtually or in person. To make this an entirely ethical exchange, there would be a pre-meeting with the class teacher to review any questions and content of the conversation.

Key Information:

Our topic this half term is all about hot and cold places. We would love if you could send in any pictures of holidays that your child has been on especially if they were in hot or cold places.

Please ensure that your child has a PE kit and that it is in a separate PE bag. PE kits need to remain in school for the half term.

Home Learning:

Our Learning at Home Grids are made available on seesaw. These grids include a variety of optional challenges linked to the topics your child is covering in class and reinforce the knowledge and skills taught.

We encourage families to share the learning that the children have done at home on Seesaw.

Each day, please ensure your child reads at home and changes their book regularly in class. Please comment on your child's reading at home through Seesaw at least once per week. Books bags <u>must</u> be in school on Fridays.

What are we learning?

This term in English, we will be reading Meerkat Mail by Emily Gravett. We will be learning to write postcards in sentences using question marks and exclamation marks. We will be using adjectives and nouns in writing and using suffixes – 'ed' and 'ing'. We will be learning to write fact files and a recount.

This half term in Maths we will be recapping on addition and subtraction families. We will be counting, reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals. We will be counting in multiples of twos fives and tens and finding quarter and half of a shape or amount. We will also be doing measuring and beginning to record capacity and volume. The children will be learning to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour.

Our Science topic this half term is seasons. Children will learn about different clothes they would wear in hot and cold weather and why some seasons are hotter than others.

Year 2 children will be doing PE every Monday and Thursday. It is essential children bring in the correct PE kit. Please ensure <u>all</u> items are labelled.

Home Learning:

Our Learning at Home Grids are made available on Seesaw.These grids include a variety of optional challenges linked to our topic. Please share your learning on Seesaw!

Each day, please ensure your **child reads at home and changes their book regularly in class** (on any day). Please comment on your child's reading at home through **Seesaw** at least once per week.

Mangahigh and TTRS/Numbots apps support the learning we do in class. You can also continue to play the games presented in last half term's maths workshop. Spelling Shed can also be used to practice our weekly spellings.

What are we learning?

We are doing a geography topic this half term, titled, 'How different are the environments close to our school?' We will be learning about our local geography and what makes up the environment ground us.

This term, in English, children will be exploring the text Grandad's Secret Giant, by David Litchfield, and diary writing, using our trip to Didsbury. Children will be learning about setting description, suffixes, apostrophes, and much more!

This half term in Maths we will be focussing on shapes, 2D and 3D, before moving on to fractions, where we'll be learning about quarters, thirds and halves, and find parts of a set.

In Science, we'll be learning about how trees grow, their importance and links to our local environment.

Key Information:

In Year 3 we have PE lessons every **Monday and Friday.** Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school all week and that all items are labelled.

What are we learning?

This half term our we will be on a History Learning Journey, answering the question: "Why was Ancient Egypt's civilization ahead of its time?" In this topic we will be learning about how the Ancient Egyptians. We will study different types of pyramids, how people in Ancient Egypt used the River Nile to grow crops and how artefacts can tell us about what life was like. We will also explore the Ancient Egyptians religious culture and the afterlife.

In English this half term, we are undertaking a Shakespeare unit and exploring the story A Midsummer Night's Dream. The children have fully immersed themselves already in this magical story and we can't wait to see how it inspires their own writing.

In our Maths lessons this half term, we will continue to deepen our knowledge on telling time to the nearest minute, answering word problems about time as well as reading a 24 hour clock.

In Science, we will learn about the bones, muscles and tendons in the human body We are learning the names of bones in the skeleton and how they help us move and grow.

Home Learning:

Multiplication tables practice continues to be a high priority for Y4. Please refer to the Times Tables 'heat map' that we recently shared to direct your home practice.

Please ensure regular practice of our weekly spellings takes place. Please see Seesaw for the weekly spelling check result.

The Home Learning Grid is also published on Seesaw and we love to see any project work uploaded to Seesaw.

What are we learning?

This half term, we will be exploring the learning question - How did Britain change between the end of the Iron Age and the end of the Roman **occupation?** We will be looking closely at how the Roman empire expanded, how to use historical sources, who the gladiators were and why Hadrian's wall was built.

We will continue our exploration of Shakespeare's 'The Tempest' through collaboration with NorthWest Drama, and begin devising our original piece ready for The Lowry theatre show in Julu.

Our Maths learning will be on three main focus areas: time, money, and Roman numerals. We will apply our knowledge of decimal notation when solving money problems, calculate time intervals in hours, minutes and seconds, and learn to read and write using the Roman numeral system.

Our Science unit will cover learning around the three states of matter, the water cucle, and the effect of warming and cooling on some materials.

What are we learning?

This half term we will be exploring the learning question - Why should the rainforest be important to us all?, linking our science topic - Living things and their habitats.

In English, we will be using the text **The Varmints written by Helen Ward.** We will be exploring themes of environmentalism, creating our own setting and character descriptions.

In Maths, we will continue to learn about decimals and percentages, properties and shape and position and direction.

Linking to our learning question, in DT, we will be creating our own textile banner to 'save the rainforest' and completing a peaceful protest. We will be utilising our sewing skills to applique text to make our banners stand out!

What are we learning?

In Summer 1, we will be exploring a new History learning challenge: 'Why did the Islamic Golden Age advance history?'.

This half term, in **English**, we will be exploring adventure stories whilst reading 'Kensuke's Kingdom', before we start our last text of primary school, 'The Final Year'. In **Maths**, we will be looking at working out missing angles as well as other areas of shape, space and measure.

We have a new exciting Art unit this half term, which will involve using procreate on the Ipads to design food packaging!

By the end of the half term, we will also be preparing for our **end of year production**- very exciting!







What have we been up to?

Year 1

Year 1 children loved visiting Stockport hat museum. We learnt about how felt hats were made. We toured the museum and completed lots of fun activities.



Year 2

Year 2 loved learning about money and pretending to buy and sell things. We learnt about calculating change and using money. We were also inspired by our Midsummer Night's Dream learning to create dances, using scarves to enhance our pieces.

Year 3

We loved learning about life in the Mediterranean in our Geography topic last half term. Inspired by this, we produced beautiful brochures for European destinations in our English lessons.

In Art, we explored the links with art and music and loved painting in large scale, responding to the rhythms and beats heard in the music.





What have we been up to?

Year 4

We loved getting creative with our DT torch-making project and linking this with theatre lighting for our Shakespeare project.
We also created Shakespearean spells and included ingredients such as, 'a fragment of a ship's sail' and 'moss from a lost island'.

We were over the moon to hear we were learning about space in Science. Not only that, we created a space themed dance and shared our performances. We enjoyed our trip to Fletcher Moss Park, where we explored expressive art in the style of Van Gogh using the nature around us as our inspiration!
