HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME?

Each half term, a new home learning grid will be uploaded to Seesaw along with weekly spellings. Activities will be set each week on Spag.com and Mangahigh. Home learning activities are due on Friday and are monitored by class teachers. The activities set support learning happening in the classroom. Every Thursday, there will be a spelling check in class. It is also important that your child reads at home and uploads this to Seesaw. This can be a photo of their book with page numbers read, or just a simple note.

After lunch, our afternoons will consist of a range of subjects, depending on the half term.




























PE kits will be needed in school every Monday (Gymnastics/Dance) and Thursday (Outdoor Games).






