




MR CULLEN

I am looking forward to seeing you all in Year 3 in September.




MISS JOHNSON

At the beginning of each half term, we'll send home a Home Learning Grid, similar to those Mr Cullen sent out in Year 2, and the spellings to learn for that half term. This will be posted to Seesaw.

On the learning at home grid, there will be a variety of tasks for every subject that you can complete in your own time and tick off. There will be some activities that we suggest are completed weekly, such as reading, spellings and times tables and some that you can work on over a few weeks.

At the beginning of the year, we will give out your maths app logins (Times Table Rockstar/Numbots and Mangahigh) so you can access the app at home and practise your times tables, addition and subtraction and other areas of maths.

We will also give out your Oxford Reading buddy logins so you can access a wealth of books and texts that suit your level of reading.

Your logins will be the same as in Year 2. If you lose them, please let your class teacher know.

We also recommend that you read daily at home, with an adult. This can be your banded book, a book from your class book corner or a book of your own. Try to read aloud as well as listening to an adult read. Discussing the book, what's happened, what could happen next etc is really helpful too! Try to read a variety of texts, poetry, nonfiction, fiction, newspapers etc.

A TYPICAL DAY IN YEAR 3



Our days starts at 8:50, with the register at 9:00. There will be a morning challenge task, just like in Year 2, on the board to start your day. It really helps speed up our morning if you have already chosen your lunch at home.

3C, 3S and 3RS will enter by the entrance near the canteen.

3J and 3K enter by the door onto the playing field, by the car park.

Our morning lasts until 12:30, with a 15 minute break for playtime at 10:45. We'll usually do Guided Reading, English and Maths during this time. On Friday mornings you'll have a few different teachers, including P.E (games) and music.

The afternoon in Year 3 is from 1:30 to 3:20. Afternoons usually include work around our half termly learning journey question or subjects such as Science, Spanish, Computing, Religion and PE (gymnastics or dance). Our first learning journey question is 'What causes earthquakes, mountains and volcanoes?'

P.E in Year 3 will be on Mondays and Fridays. We recommend you keep your kit in school, in your locker, all week, taking it home half termly.

Remember to label all of your children's school clothes.









CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

In Year 3 we will be exploring many different areas of the National Curriculum. Each half term we will start with a new topic based around our learning question, see below.

Our learning questions will be:

Autumn 1: How are Volcanoes, Earthquakes and Mountains formed? (Geography focus)

Autumn 2; How can I make a large structure to support sustainability? (Design and Technology focus)

Spring 1: Who first lived in Britain? (History focus)

Spring 2: Why do people holiday in the Mediterranean? (Geography focus)

Summer 1: What are the wonders of Ancient Egypt? (History focus)

Summer 2: What came first, the blossom or the apple? (Science focus)


Each half term we will be learning a different part of the science curriculum, with the last half term being a larger focus on plants. Aligning with our volcanoes learning question, we will be learning about geology in our Autumn 1 science focus.

We will explore a range of texts and writing styles in our English lessons, with our first being, Escape from Pompeii by Christina Balit. We will be writing setting descriptions and a non-fiction information text on our geography learning.

In maths, we will start the year with a place value focus, before moving onto graphs and then addition and subtraction. Over the year, we will cover the whole of the Year 3 maths curriculum. It is expected that children have learnt their 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of Year 3.

In Year 3 we will be going on some fantastic trips, including a two-night residential to Dobroyd Castle, part of Robin Wood. We'll be visiting Manchester Jewish Museum, Manchester Museum and two trips to our local area.

EXPECTATIONS - ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY



We expect all children to be in school and on time every day. Our doors open at 08:50 each morning.

Punctuality is important for your child to settle into their day and not miss any valuable learning time.

If your child is unwell, it's crucial that you inform us as soon as possible. Please follow our attendance policy by ringing the school office in the morning, stating the reason for their absence.

EXPECTATIONS - BEHAVIOUR & WELLBEING



At Beaver Road, we foster a positive and nurturing environment where all children feel safe and happy.

We expect every child to be a kind and respectful member of our school community. This includes how they interact with their peers, teachers, and how they care for our school environment.

Your child's class teacher will communicate with you directly if they have any concerns regarding your child's behaviour or wellbeing. We believe in working together to ensure every child thrives.

EXPECTATIONS - READY TO LEARN



To help your child have a successful day, we ask that they come to school prepared with the following:

- Named Water Bottle: Filled with water, ready to stay hydrated throughout the day.
- Reading Book: To support their reading journey.
- PE Kit: Please make sure your child has their <u>labelled</u> PE kit on the following days: Monday and Friday



EXPECTATIONS - SEESAW



We value strong home-school communication. Your child's class teacher will regularly update you on curriculum information, class activities using Seesaw. Please ensure you have downloaded the Seesaw app and are connected to your child's account.



SCHOOL UNIFORM



It is important that your child comes to school in the correct school uniform:

- Blue jumper/cardigan
- Grey trousers, shorts, pinafore or skirt
- Plain black shoes or trainers. There must be no visible logos and soles must also be black.
- No jewellery (apart from small studs, which must be covered for PE)
- Plain black PE kits
- Please label all of your children's clothes, including coats and winter wear.
