


MS TAGGART- 2T



<u>Year 2 at Beaver Road</u>



Year 2 is an integral year for children as it is their last year in KS1 and they will be building on existing skills and knowledge to ensure they have a concrete understanding of the KS1 curriculum. Year 2 has also historically been the year that children completed their end of KS1 SATs. Since the academic year 2023-24, the KS1 SATs have no longer been statutory, but we still take part in the optional SATs.

In Year 2, children will be learning skills they will need to be happy and productive citizens of the world. We provide a creative and challenging curriculum that inspires our children and prepares them for life in a culturally diverse and everchanging world. Our values ensure that children question, discover and become resilient, independent learners. Our Curriculum will prepare our children for life-long learning.









- Children will be sent a termly Learning At
 Home grid related to the topics covered in
 class. Additional practise material will be
 shared as and where necessary.
- It is extremely important for children to read for at least 10 minutes a day at home to improve their reading fluency. Children will be sent a reading book which they can change when they finish the book. We encourage children to read their book three times before changing. Seesaw is also used as a tool to support Reading at Home in line with the guidance and expectations set out https://example.com/here.





Please also ensure that children practise the Year 1 & 2 Common Exception Word list. This will help with both reading and writing. Where needed children will be sent home activities to work on their phonetic skills.

Snack and Lunch

PE Kits

PE kits need to be in school every day to ensure your child can participate fully in PE lessons. In cold weather, it is advisable to send in jogging bottoms and a long sleeved top. PE days will be confirmed at the start of the term.

<u>Learning Environments</u>

All Year 2 classrooms are designed to give children the opportunity to learn by exploring exciting learning environments which help deepen their understanding of concepts taught in class.

Common areas in all classrooms include Reading Areas, Investigation Areas, Maths/Writing Areas and Creative Areas. All classrooms also include calming areas with Zones of Regulation to help children regulate their emotions and practise mindfulness activities. Children's Rights and the Global Goals for Sustainable Development are embedded in all areas of the classrooms with class charters designed and made by the children at the beginning of the year.







CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

English Curriculum

Our English curriculum is underpinned by a strong emphasis on the importance of reading in order to build the foundations for children's understanding of all areas of learning and the wider world.


It is essential for children to read daily, both at school and at home as this will allow children to become more fluent and independent readers. Creating a reading environment and routine at home will be incredibly important in ensuring children's success in Year 2. If you would like tips and information about how to do this, we are happy to help and answer any queries you may have.

With the building blocks of language enhanced by reading, children's own writing will also start to flourish. We encourage parents to support English development at home by practising the weekly spelling rules shared by teachers. In addition to this, there is also a key emphasis on letter formation and handwriting. We will be teaching handwriting formation and joins in class regularly and practising these at home will complement children's classroom learning.


