Reading

Reading with children, rather than just to them is one of the most impactful ways you can enhance their development, it is also lots of fun!

What is it?

In dialogic reading, the adult helps the child become the teller of the story. The adult becomes the listener, the questioner, the audience for the child. No one can learn to play the piano just by listening to someone else play. Likewise, no one can learn to read just by listening to someone else read. Children learn most from books when they are actively involved.

Writing

Learning to write is a complex process that involves learning many skills. First, children need to learn to speak, build their vocabulary and develop the fine motor coordination they will need to manipulate a writing instrument. As they grow, they need to learn about the alphabet and to make connections between spoken and written words.

Subitising

In Nursery, we are on a mission for all children to become expert subitzers.

Why?

Subitising lays the foundation for more advanced mathematical understanding by allowing children to grasp the concept of number as a quantity, rather than just a symbol or a sequence. By being able to recognize small groups of objects without counting, children can develop a strong sense of numbers and their relationships.

When they practise subitising, children develop their ability to recognize and quickly comprehend the quantities of objects, a skill that can help them with mental calculations, estimation and problem-solving.
