Dear Parents and Carers,

Following the updates and announcements yesterday from the government and the national guidance, our school remains open today. However, we are implementing further measures in school from today to help keep all our school community as safe as possible.

In addition to procedures already in place, here is a summary of additional arrangements in place from today....

- All children who have symptoms, including a new continuous cough or a temperature, will be sent home and required to self-isolate for at least 14 days. If your child has any of these symptoms, please let the school know immediately.
- If you live with others and you or one of them have symptoms of coronavirus, then all household members must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.
- While children are in school, there will continue to be supervised washing of hands as children enter and exit school, before snack times, before and after lunchtime, PE, cooking activities, and each time children have been to the toilet.
- Children must only use their own water bottles in class and must take them home each evening to be cleaned thoroughly.
- Site staff and cleaners will prioritise thoroughly cleaning high touch areas every day and midday wherever possible.
- No assemblies or large gatherings will take place in school.
- Non-essential visits, visitors and meetings both inside and outside of school will be cancelled until the end of term initially. This includes residentials, school trips, all visitors, all music teaching, staff meetings, SLT meetings, governors meetings, trustee meetings, parent meetings, PTA coffee mornings/meetings, external clubs and all lettings.
- With immediate effect, all after school clubs including multi-sports are suspended. However, the Beaver Road before and after school childcare will remain open.







 Non essential communication with parents and visitors will be over the phone and/or via email.

Understandably, your child will have many questions about the coronavirus.
