



DEFINITION OF A CHILD

Article 1 – Definition of the Child
Everyone under the age of 18 has all the rights in the
Convention.

Article 4 – Implementation of the Convention
Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights
