Also, please don't forget Mr Knowles' daily workout videos. He has even managed to persuade me to join in – so if I can, you can too!



After the school holidays, the weekly list of activities which we put on our website's class pages will be uploaded by Friday 5pm ready for the following week, starting from Friday 17th April. By uploading the week's activities before the weekend, those parents and carers who would like to familiarise themselves with the work, before the week begins, are able to do so.

We will continue to share the learning we would like children to do at home in the same format, however, by using Seesaw, the children can share what they have done with the class teacher and get feedback. In Nursery and Reception, the children will continue to do the same using Tapestry. We hope this will help motivate the children to continue to learn, whilst also making the work more

purposeful. For this to happen for children in Years 1 to 6, we need you to download the Seesaw app.

At a later date, staff will begin to share the week's activities using Seesaw. However, we are conscious we don't want to overload parents and carers who are already trying to juggle home and work simultaneously. Therefore, as this is new to both families and staff, for now we will only be using Seesaw for the children to share their work with their class teachers.

The Year 5 team and some of the classes in year 6 sent home QR codes before the school building closed last Friday. However, the children in Years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 will be receiving home sign in codes next week. As soon as you receive your personal code, please download the app ready to share the work your child has done for after the school holidays.







The children in Early Years already have Tapestry, which we encourage parents and carers to continue to use to share what their child has been learning at home. Therefore, Nursery and Reception families do not need to download Seesaw.

Please continue to look after yourselves and your families, and stay safe at home.
