As well as being a fun way to share a performance with family and make memorable connections with our loved ones, this will also be an opportunity to raise funds for the NSPCC, who as you may have read about in the media, are experiencing a noticeable increase in calls and service use since lockdown started.



At Beaver Road, we invite all children to be advocates for other children's Rights and take action to support others who may not be enjoying their Right to being safe or whose dignity and wellbeing is being undermined. This is our collective way of taking action in supporting children's Rights and we know that our children will do an amazing job, as always!

- Puppet theatre or Magic show upcycling / recycled props and sock puppets

- Storytelling
- Mime / juggling / circus skills

A quick checklist...

- Choose a day for your show (w/b 25th May) and invite your family and friends.
- Give the Just Giving page details to your audience members so they can buy a ticket
- Practice, practice, PRACTICE!
- Create an advertising flyer and any props you may need.
- On the day / evening of your show, ask a grown-up to take photos or video clips to share with your class teacher via Tapestry or Seesaw.

- Have fun with your performance and feel proud!

The Great Reading Adventure...where will you go on your adventure?

At Beaver Road we believe in the proven power of reading to tackle life's big challenges. Reading anything for the joy of it gives huge mental health benefits and for this reason we are promoting reading as one method to ensure positive Mental Health through our very own reading competition 'The Great Reading Adventure'. There are two different ways children can enter our competition:

1) List all the places you have visited whilst reading a book, whether it be Hogwarts, the Three Bears cottage or Greg Hefley's house from Diary of a Wimpy Kid. Books transport you to places you could never visit in real life. And when the key message from our Government has been 'Stay Home', we wanted to encourage the children of Beaver Road to travel to far off lands by reading.



2) Create an image depicting the scene/ setting from your favourite book. This could be a picture, painting or even a cake decoration. Anything goes.



All entries to the competition need to be shared with the class teacher on Tapestry or Seesaw by Monday 1st June and the winners will be announced in Mrs Hardy's newsletter as well as on twitter and the school website. Each winner will also win books for their class, which have kindly been bought by the Beaver Road PTA.
