

Holiday Activities and Curriculum Update

As we draw to the end of the Summer Term and prepare for the summer holidays, we'd like to share some curriculum updates with you and explain some of the activities your children might enjoy getting involved with over the next 6 weeks.

Firstly, Beaver Road has commissioned the author, Paul Morris, to make a video for the children of Beaver Road. Paul has written several books including Danny and the Code Breaker. He also ran a workshop in our school last year and was definite hit with the children at the Junior School.

The theme of his workshop is **identity**.

The video contains just over thirty minutes of workshop content, then a bonus content 'World Premier' reading of an action scene from his new book. *The Paradise Machine*.


In the main workshop, he finishes by setting the children the task of writing a piece to be entitled 'THIS IS ME', where the children are to declare their own detailed identity using guidance they've had in the video. He later stops reading his new book at a cliffhanging moment and suggests the children might like to write an ending for the



scene. Children can still share these pieces of writing on Seesaw as we will not be updating our Seesaw accounts to our new classes until September. You could also bring what you have written into school with you to share with your new teacher, which we will then pass onto Paul to read. He will be awarding a prize of a signed copy of one of his books for the most impressive writing. We look forward to reading your ideas.
