Attendance and punctuality is excellent since we have returned this September. Thank you for working with us to ensure this. In order to ensure drop off and collection arrangements are as safe and smooth as possible, we have reviewed and adapted these over the last week. We appreciate your cooperation with these arrangements, especially as we continue to face an increase in COVID-19 cases locally and nationally.

Transport and parking Thank you for completing the questionnaire we sent out last week. It is great to see how many children are choosing healthy ways to travel to school. 88% of those who completed the questionnaire travel by walking/cycling/scooter for all or part of their journey, which is excellent! If you need to drive to school, we encourage you to park and stride wherever possible. If you are a Junior School parent, please show respect to patients and staff of the medical centre by never using their car park when collecting your children. Please use The Didsbury car park that is just a short walk away from the Junior School – this is both a healthier

and safer choice. Following complaints from some of our neighbours at the First School, please ensure you park legally and safely. We recommend you park at least a 5 minute walk away from school and then walk the rest of the way.



Zoom Curriculum Induction Meetings for Year 1 – Year 6



On Wednesday 16th September @3.45PM and again @ 4.30PM we will be holding two Zoom year group inductions, which will last approximately 20 to 30 minutes. As we are not able to run our usual 'Learning at Home' events this term, due to COVID-19 Health & Safety procedures, we have decided to provide parents and carers with information about their child's year group recovery curriculum and the ways you can support their learning at home





virtually. We will be holding two Zoom year group inductions, which will be delivered by the teachers in each year group. We will also share the Powerpoints after the events on our website year group class pages. Remote Learning



In the event that a class or year group bubble needs to temporarily close or individual children and staff need to self-isolate because of COVID-19, we are currently reviewing and redeveloping how our remote learning will be provided alongside our teaching and learning in school. School Building and Grounds Improvements



We have numerous building improvements planned for this year. You may have already noticed the roof repairs currently in progress at the Junior school. Unfortunately, there has been a design issue meaning extensive roof leaks into the Junior school building and the art room suffering flooding. These are now being rectified and we hope the new design will keep us dry in future!

We are delighted that we have been successful in our funding bid to replace the external fencing and railings around the First

School site. This work will be starting soon and we look forward to much higher and safer fencing as well as wider entrance gates. More details will follow soon about how and when the work will take place. We will also be in touch later in the term about the replacement floors in the First School.



We are very pleased to be able to continue our playground developments at the First School now we are back in school and the playground company is operational again. We are currently planning for the next phase of the KS1 playground and now have plans ready to share with you soon for our new Early Years outdoor area. Once the fencing work is completed, we will be able to plan dates for these new installations during the year.
