Dear Parents and Carers,

Whilst our return to school at the beginning of last week was a positive one, we are all deeply saddened by the news of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II last Thursday. We join the nation in sharing our condolences with the Royal Family and are thankful for the constant dedication, wisdom, selfless service and care The Queen gave throughout her life, which will remain an inspiration to us all. We spent time in our assemblies with the children on Friday morning to reflect on the incredible life of The Queen and explain that we are now entering a period of national mourning.



As you may have heard over the weekend in the news, Monday 19th September has been announced as the day of the State Funeral. This day will be a bank holiday and therefore school will be closed on this day as a mark of respect. We will reopen as usual on Tuesday 20th September. During this period of national mourning before the state funeral, we will continue to operate as normal. However, please note that our social media and school communications will be limited to essential information only.

Manchester City Council and the City of Manchester will be observing this period of mourning. Please see below information about local Manchester mourning details. These include, but are not limited to:

- Union Jack flags flying at half-mast.
- Floral tributes in St Ann's Square, city centre. Please note, these will be removed the day after the State Funeral.
- Books of Condolences in the Reading Room in Central Library 9am 6pm every day until the day after the State Funeral.
- Some City events are being cancelled or postponed. You are advised to check before attending.
- A special service to commemorate the life of Her Majesty at <u>Manchester Cathedral</u> on Sunday 18th September.
- Council Services will continue to operate as normal as stated in the <u>National Mourning</u> guidance
- Council social media channels and internal communications will be limited to essential service information only.











- The National Book of Condolence, which will be kept by the Royal Household will be hosted at www.royal.uk/condolence
- Sombre dress code is advised for the period of national mourning in public facing services
