Dear Parents and Carers,

We had a great week welcoming all the children back last week despite the national and local lockdown situation. This half term we look forward to various school events, so please make a note of them all and support us in keeping our school as safe and open as we possibly can.



Health and Safety

As we have entered this new national lockdown together, we are taking some additional precautions in school to lessen the impact of COVID-19. These include:

- Shrinking the year group bubbles as much as possible so that children are in class bubbles only wherever possible.
- Ensuring minimal movement of staff between both schools. The senior leadership team will alternate between schools each week. However, there will continue to be one member of the SLT outside of school every day.
- Additional safety precautions in place for staff in school.

We would also like to ask for your support in ensuring further safety measures as the children enter and leave school each day. These include:

- Ensuring your children do not arrive early to school each day. This is a particular issue
 at the Junior school, where many Year 5 children are arriving 10 minutes early. This
 causes congestion as Year 4 and 6 children arrive at 8.30am. Year 5 must not arrive
 at school before 8.40am to avoid the children mixing with other classes and year
 groups.
- Ensuring that only one adult from the family brings the children to school and that adults wear face coverings on school premises.
- Continuing to leave the school grounds promptly after your children have been dropped
 off in the morning and collected at the end of each day.
- Dismounting all bikes and scooters once you enter the school grounds. This is to avoid congestion as well as to ensure there are no accidents.

This year, more than ever, we have witnessed the positive power that society can have when we come together to tackle a common challenge.

School Building and Grounds Improvements



Thank you for your co-operation and patience while the building works are completed at school. Unfortunately, the roof repairs at the Junior school have suffered from additional complications and the contractors are continuing to seek solutions for these as soon as possible.

The work at the First School to replace the external fencing and railings has started and we can already see the benefits this will bring. We have received some

questions about the height of the new fencing and the width of the new gates. Please be assured that these are in line with the recommended specifications schools are advised to have for safety and safeguarding of the children, as well as being in line with our planning



permission. The reason we were successful with our funding bid to replace the fencing is because the old height and condition of the existing fence was not deemed as safe enough. Unfortunately, we have suffered from many intruders and vandalism over the years, as well as concerns from parents about how low the fence is for safeguarding reasons. The entrance gates will all be wider than the old entrance gates and also meet the specifications required for the works. The main entrance gate will remain a single gate, as this will be magnetised with an intercom system fitted. In future, this gate will be locked during school hours so our whole school grounds are more secure. The entrance gate onto the KS1 playground will be a double gate for improved access to and from school.

We are delighted to report that the work to replace all the classroom and office floors at the First School has started well and is currently ahead of schedule. The Year 2 children have adapted amazingly well to their new temporary classrooms and very soon they will be moving back into their refreshed classrooms. We will then be moving to the next phase of the works. You will hear from us in more detail when it affects your child's classroom.

Whilst all this work is being carried out at the First School, we are aware that access to/from and around our school grounds is more restricted and can become more congested than previously. In order not to shorten the school day with revised and extended drop off and collection times, we are asking parents and carers to be patient and take their time when exiting the school grounds to ensure social distancing can still be adhered to. Please also ensure you do not arrive early to school for your drop off and collection time and also make sure only one adult in your household brings and collects your child. These measures will really help if they are followed. However, if this continues to be an issue, we will revise the drop off and collection times.

We have some other festive surprises for the children this half term – so please do look out for them! We are all doing our best to ensure the children have as much fun as possible during these restrictive times.
