Returning to School



We are still waiting for more information from the government and the DFE about how the children will return to school from Monday 8th March. In the meantime, we encourage you to continue with the current routine and please do let us know if there is anything we can help with.

I know some of you will have concerns about how the children will be supported when they do all return to school. Although there is no magic solution to this unique situation, we will do our best to meet the children's varying needs. As well as our quality first approach to teaching and learning, we will adopt additional approaches to identifying and addressing children's needs and any gaps in learning. We will work together with you to enable needs led interventions and support as necessary. Our curriculum and catch up funding planning and provision will also be reviewed in light of children's identified needs and additional funding made available to us from the DFE.
